
During winter, it's harder for animals to find food but animals like squirrels, moles, foxes and jays have a clever trick up their sleeves. They create a store (or a cache) of food by hiding it underground, or in their nests or dens. They can then go back to it whenever they feel hungry.

Test your cache-finding memory with this matching game. You can play on your own or with another person.



HOW TO PLAY

- Cut out the tiles and lay them out on a table or the floor. Be careful when using scissors.
- 2. Take time to remember what food each animal eats
- 3. Turn all the tiles over so that they are face-down
- 4. Mix them up without looking at the picture underneath no peeking!
- Now turn over two at a time to see if you can find the animal and food pairs
- 6. If you match the animal with its food you can keep the pair
- 7. If you end up with an odd pair.
 turn those two back over and have
 another go
- 8. See how quickly you can find them all
